Analysis of the same was done by faculty and records are maintained and suggestions are given to students.
- Institution has Student Adaptation Scheme for mentoring the students. Faculties give personal guidance and counselling on both academic and non-academic matters to the students through mentoring.
- Through periodical meetings with mentee, mentors take all information of students personally and keep track of his/her academic performance, attendance record, examination marks and various co-curricular activities.
